

How to Check for Registration for Selective Service

According to federal law, males born on or after January 1, 1960, are required to register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday and up to, but not including, their 26th birthday. Selective Service can accept a late registration, but not after the individual has reached his 26th birthday. Individuals, which may have failed to register during the time they were required to do so, may be determined ineligible for certain benefits, such as:

- federal student loans and grant programs
- federal job training under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (formerly Workforce Investment Act)
- federal jobs or security clearance as a contractor
- U.S. citizenship for immigrants

To Check Selective Service Registration:



- Visit www.sss.gov
- Click on the "Registration" tab, then "Check a Registration"
- Select "Verify Now"
- Enter Last Name, Social Security Number, and Date of Birth
- Complete reCAPTCHA
- Press "Submit"
- Select "Print Letter"
- **If no registration is available, double check that you entered all information correctly. If information is correct, the registration may not be verifiable at this time. Please call 1-847-688-3117 for more info.
